1. Is the Doctor a Specialist?

Orthodontists receive an additional 2-3 years of specialized education, beyond dental school, to learn the proper way to straighten and align teeth. Orthodontists practice orthodontics and dentofacial orthopedics exclusively.

2. Is your orthodontist Board Certified?

Only 1 out of 6 orthodontists has gone through the rigorous testing of the American Board of Orthodontists. These orthodontists have proven to the board that their finished cases have met the highest standards in the world. Only board certified orthodontists can display the Diplomate logo of the ABO.





3. Does the doctor use bonded brackets instead of bands around the teeth?

In surveying our patients, we've found one of the most uncomfortable aspects of getting braces is having spacers and bands placed. We've virtually eliminated this practice from our office, opting instead to use small, sleek brackets that are bonded to each tooth instead of the older metal bands.

5. Does the doctor use the latest technology for improved comfort and performance?

The most important part to achieving a straight smile is keeping it that way. The retainers and the retainer check-ups are two of the most important parts of orthodontic treatment. Keeping your teeth straight for the rest of your life requires continued retainer wear and check-ups to make sure everything is staying where the orthodontist put it. Having extra retainers help ensure the investment in your smile will not be lost.



8. Does the practice charge for emergency appointments?

Some discomfort can be anticipated with braces. Adjustment of poking wires and palliative care to place our patients in comfort are provided free of charge. Whether it is during normal business hours or after-hours or on week-ends. You will not have to pay extra for our office going the extra mile.
